- I. Introduction/Principles/Roles and Responsibilities (Mary)
 - a. Mary Lidstrom will be chairing this board meeting, and introduced the board members. This governance board was assembled as eScience was formally moved to UWIT.
 - b. Mary reviewed the Hyak Principles document with the board; they include:
 - i. Provide maximum utility to the UW research community
 - ii. Manage Hyak as one element in an integrated, scalable research cyberinfrastructure, including:
 - 1. HYAK
 - 2. lolo
 - 3. networks
 - 4. data center
 - iii. Business model should emphasize shared risk/reward: Stakeholders invest consistent with expected return
 - 1. Provost reduces capital construction risk
 - 2. eScience reduces barrier to entry for all users
 - 3. Deans sustainable compute investment, faculty recuitment/retention
 - 4. Users maximum utility from nodes, elastic capacity
 - iv. Address specific research computing challenges where we can do better than the alternatives
 - c. The roles and responsibilities of this board include:
 - i. Oversee function
 - ii. Set goals and policy
 - 1. Budget issues, including rates and leveraging
 - 2. System architecture
 - 3. Service model
 - 4. Changes proposed by UW-IT, users, and ohters
 - iii. Address conflicts among Hyak participants
 - d. The Board will meet monthly until fall, then quarterly
- II. Hyak Usage (Chance)
 - a. Chance Reschke reviewed the PP presentation on Hyak usage (attached), price trends and opportunities, and the stakeholder and sponsor users and their needs.
